

BRUSH COLLECTION POLICY

- The Borough Crew will remove any small limbs or landscape trimmings that you may
 accumulate on a weekly basis. Pick up day for this service is every Monday as
 schedule allows. If a holiday falls on a Monday, the collection will be the following
 day. If a large volume of items is to be picked up, the pickup may extend into
 Tuesday.
- Please have the items placed along the street the night before so nothing is missed.
 Also limit the amount of brush on a weekly basis to one (1) pile no larger than approximately 3 foot wide by 5 foot long by 3 foot high. Any loose objects (landscape trimmings/leaves, etc.) should be bagged.
- Please contact the Borough office before starting any large trimming, pruning or tree removal project.
- Entire trees and shrubbery items that are removed should be disposed of by the owner, either by the company or individuals contracted to remove the items.
- In the event of severe storm damage to trees, the removal of limbs and branches can also be coordinated with the Borough office.
- We will not pick up any ground/stones/mulch or grass clippings.

Book Barn & Little Libraries

Marvin Heimbach was a professor in outdoor education at Virginia Tech and worked in an outreach with youth, example would be 4-H extension. Leigh Ann Mobarik wanted a living memorial for her father, Marvin Heimbach, who resided on 11th Avenue in Shamokin Dam. The family started a Book Barn located at St. Matthews Church. The family requested an expansion of the Book Barn and with the cooperation and the support from Borough Council: the Borough crew will be installing Little Libraries and books will be available the first day of Spring at the Jack Treas Park, Attig Park, and Weller Field park. The Book Barn and Little Libraries are a book sharing, where you take a book, read it, and then return the book. If you would like to donate books, drop them off at the Book Barn at St. Matthews Church. This is all possible as a community effort with the family, St. Matthews Church, and the Borough.

IS YOUR STREETLIGHT OUT

All streetlights located along Borough Streets are the responsibility of PPL Utilities. Giving PPL the pole number when you call to report the outage allows them to pinpoint the location and speed up the repairs.

You will find the pole number on a metal strip attached to the pole. It will always be five digits, followed by a S, and then five more digits, for example 12345/S67890. Once you have the pole number, call PPL at 1-800-342-5775 or the Borough office at 570-743-7565.

Information from the Borough Office

Your water/sewer bills can be emailed instead of mailed every quarter.

Your water/sewer bills can be paid through an automatic payment. Each quarter you will receive a water/sewer bill as usual with a note DO NOT PAY. Money will be deducted from your bank account. Your bank account will be charged the amount shown in the box noted as "Amount Due" on the due date. Your account will not be charged a penalty if that date falls on a weekend or holiday.

If you are interested in either of these automated transactions, please contact the Borough Office to receive the proper paperwork in order to start the process.

It has become very difficult for the Borough Crew to read some of our customer's water meters due to overgrown trees, bushes, and shrubs. A water meter touch pad may be attached to the exterior of the building, which allows the Borough Crew to read the water meter without entering the home or business. The Borough Crew must be able to easily access all water meter touch pads. Please be sure that the water meter touch pad, located on the exterior of your home or business, is easily accessible and clear of bushes, shrubs, or debris. Please call to relocate a touch pad that became enclosed by a fence.

RENTAL REGISTRATION

Rental properties are to be registered with the Borough Office. Residential rental unit is occupied by someone other than the owner of the real estate. RESTRICTIONS ON ITEMS COLLECTED:

Carpet – Must be dry, cut into 4' x 4' maximum squares & bundled.

Paint Cans – Must be thoroughly dried. (No Liquid Paint)

What to Bring: All documents you no longer need that contain personal information, including Social Security numbers, credit card numbers and bank account numbers, such as credit card statements, credit card applications, bank statements, cancelled checks, income tax information, insurance records/information, including medical retirement/pension fund information.

Unacceptable Materials: No metals such as, but not limited to 3-ring binders, batteries, electronics, large binder clips, tools; as well as, vinyl, plastics, x-rays, trash, and/or other general waste products are not acceptable for shredding. Staples and paper clips are fine. Participants shall not provide any material considered toxic or dangerous or which is regulated as hazardous materials.
